MY JOURNEY WITH SASRD – A LIFETIME OF LEARNING AND GROWTH



I landed in Medziphema in the year 1980 as a young, shy 16-year-old girl, straight from high school - knowing nothing about science or agriculture. Little did I know that this place would become my second home and shape me into the person I am today.

I spent 4 ½ years completing my graduation, which was originally a five-year course but was later condensed. What I remember most vividly are my teachers - our Physics teacher, the Soil Conservation teacher Prof. Chauhan, the Pathology teacher Sir Saha and Dr. Reddy, who taught us how to dissect frogs in the lab - a memory still so fresh in my mind. Since I had no background in science, my first year was like a dream - everything was new: the atmosphere, the subjects, the methods of study. The courses seemed so strange and unfamiliar. I still remember how one of my classmates and I would wait for our senior batchmate, who had the habit of making notes while studying. We would wait for her to finish, borrow her notes and study the night before the exam! That's how we began our academic journey - with curiosity, laughter and friendship. I also remember taking scribbling notes while studying from my own batch mates (in Physics). Every theory class, practical exam and field trip was a new adventure. It was an exciting phase of discovery and growth. Our batch, I believe, was one of the most united. We treated one another like brothers and sisters, deeply bonded by friendship and respect. We looked up to our seniors, especially the first batch, who were mature, kind and ever ready to guide us. Even our teachers were approachable - there was no distance between teacher and student. We could freely seek help and advice and that closeness made learning even more special. Those were indeed valuable years. We faced every challenge with a smile - even water scarcity! With no water in the hostels, we would go to the nearby stream to bathe and wash clothes. Electricity was a rare luxury and transportation was a challenge. To go to Dimapur, we would ride at the back of trucks and Medziphema town was just a walking distance away since there was no local conveyance. But all these hardships added to the joy and memories of our youth.

After completing my B.Sc., I went to Solan for my Master's Degree. When I returned to the Campus, it was as a young lecturer. I still remember my first class - I was so tiny and young that my students didn't take me seriously at first! But that changed soon after the first hourly exam. Those days, hourly exams were held regularly and when they realized how strict and firm I could be, they began to see me differently. From then on, mutual respect and understanding grew. That first batch of students remains special to me, as I shared a very good rapport with them.

By God's grace, I have grown in every aspect of life through this Campus - first as a student, then as a teacher, warden, administrator, researcher, and extension worker. But above all, this place has shaped me as a human being - through its ups and downs, joys and struggles, love and criticism, encouragement and discouragement. This campus has truly made me who I am today. I have spent almost two-third of my life here - five years as a student and thirty-six years as a faculty member, except for a five-year deputation to the Central Institute of Horticulture as Director.

It was also a blessing to have the opportunity to lead the Alumni Association. Along with my batchmate, Sekhose, we initiated the idea and discussed it with our seniors - Metsübo, Amu Hoto and Dr. Kire - who wholeheartedly supported and encouraged us. With their guidance and financial help, we laid the foundation of the Alumni Association in 2000 with Sekhose as President, myself as General Secretary, our seniors as Advisors and other office bearers. Those five years were indeed the golden period of the Association. We worked together as a team and achieved many milestones, cherishing every moment of it.

Later, I was also given the opportunity to lead the Teachers' Association at both the Campus and University levels. Each role, each responsibility, has been a lesson in leadership and humility.

Today, as I look back, my heart is filled with gratitude. I feel truly blessed for all that this Campus has given me - knowledge, friendships, experiences and above all, a life filled with purpose and meaning. I remain forever indebted to this School, this Campus and this University - my home for most of my life.

Legacy of Unity: The Story of SAS Alumni Association

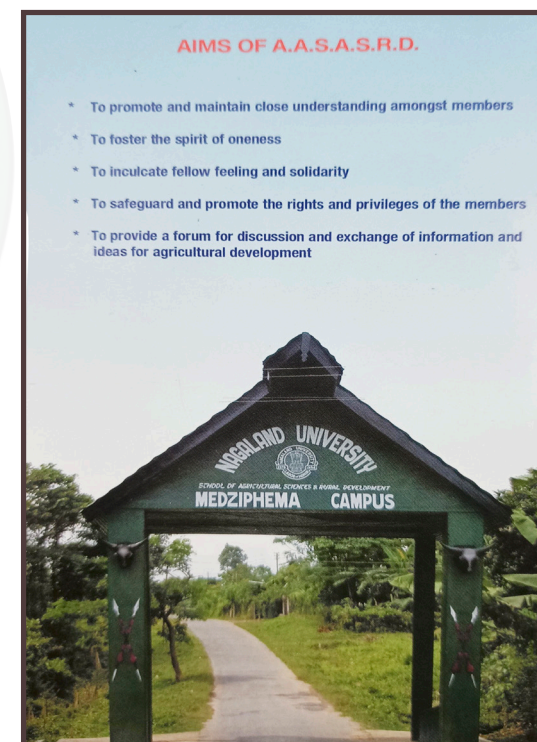
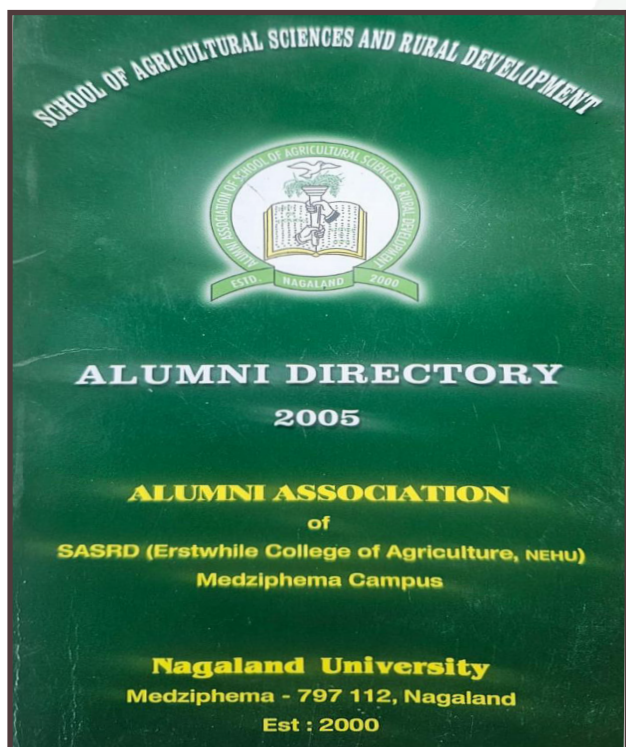
Milestones and Activities

Longon, the then Honourable Minister, Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of Nagaland in the presence of Former Vice Chancellor of Nagaland University, Lt. Prof. Pardeshi Lal.

In addition to this, three more awards were sponsored separately by various alumni for the toppers of B.Sc. (Ag.) 1st, 2nd & 3rd year students. The Peri Om Pun Excellence Award - is presented to the topper of the 1st year, sponsored by Dr. Umed Pun (7th Batch), R2 Seeds Excellence Award - is presented to the topper of the 2nd year, sponsored by Shri. C. Narayan Rao (8th Batch) and Late Cherish Ch. Marak Excellence Award - is presented to the topper of the 3rd year, sponsored by Smt. Thera Ch. Marak (8th batch) and each of these awards comprises a cash prize of ₹10,000 and a certificate.

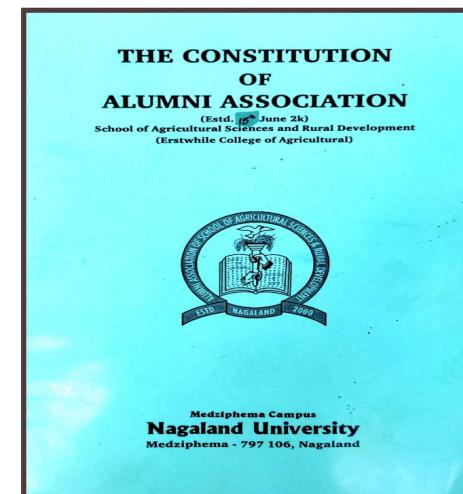

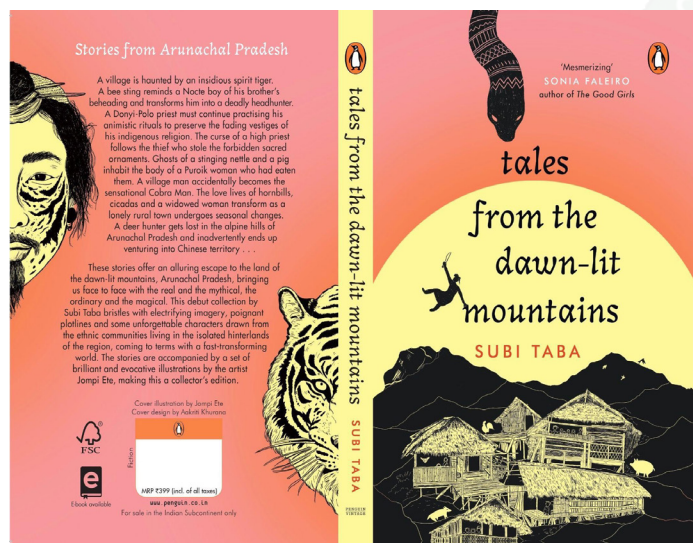

Leginino Rhotsü, a graduate of the School of Agricultural Sciences, Medziphema, Nagaland University, exemplifies how passion, education and resilience can converge to transform lives and communities. Hailing from Kohima district, the capital of Nagaland, she launched her innovative urban farming venture, “Root on Roof,” during the COVID-19 lockdown, turning a period of uncertainty into a life-changing opportunity.

She originally aspired to become a doctor, but her frequent visits to the family farm instilled in her, a deep appreciation for agriculture. Hence, with the encouragement of her parents and mentored by her aunt, Lucy Ngullie, a successful dragon fruit farmer, Leginino chose to pursue her Bachelor’s degree in Agriculture at the School of Agricultural Sciences, Medziphema Campus, Nagaland University. This decision went on to shape her life’s mission. Her education laid a strong foundation, which was supplemented with a hands-on internship in Vietnam. There, she gained vital insights into commercial farming, marketing and mechanisation.



She started by cultivating tomato plants in boxes on her rooftop. Leginino has since, up scaled her rooftop into a thriving garden, producing organic salad greens and vegetables year-round. Despite challenges like heavy monsoons and water scarcity, she has remained committed to sustainable, chemical-free farming. Her produce now reaches homes, cafes and restaurants across Kohima.

Leginino’s vision goes far beyond growing crops; she believes in growing minds. Her rooftop farm also serves as a learning space where she hosts interns from government schools, train teachers and conduct workshops to inspire youth and promote rooftop gardening. Through these efforts, she hopes to cultivate a new generation of environmentally conscious individuals who value local and organic food systems.

In addition to her urban venture, Leginino also manages an integrated farm located at Rüzaphema, Chümoukedima, where she rears poultry and grows fruits like dragon fruit, mangoes and papayas embodying a holistic approach to food and resources, sustainability.

Her Instagram handle, [root_on_roof](#), provides glimpses of her journey and promotes agriculture, not just as a livelihood, but a lifestyle. Her ultimate goal is to demonstrate that food security starts at home and that farming can thrive anywhere - even on a rooftop.

As the Alumni Association of the School of Agricultural Sciences, Medziphema celebrates its Silver Jubilee, Leginino’s journey is a reminder that success isn’t always about following the crowd but sometimes, it’s about planting your own path and letting it grow.

- Aroid Potting Mix (Sphagnum moss, Pine barks, Coco chips, etc.)
- Exotic Vegetable Seedlings (Lettuce, Kale, Celery, etc.)
- Exotic Fruit Saplings (ongoing trial)
- Landscaping Plants (Ficus, Jasmine, Plumeria, etc.)
- Plant Consultancy Services

She retails and interacts with her clients nationwide through the official Instagram page, Gardenji. The nursery has established strong markets in Kolkata, Dimapur and Kohima. Through a blend of digital and offline marketing, strategic planning and niche market development, it has achieved steady growth and consistent returns.

Looking ahead, Jungshienla aims to empower local growers, especially women and youth, by creating sustainable livelihoods in floriculture. She also plans to extend her services to the local community by encouraging unemployed youth to learn, innovate and embrace entrepreneurship.

The journey of Gardenji is proof that even small beginnings, when fuelled by dedication and persistence, can blossom into meaningful ventures, inspiring others to dream and prosper.

“KINGKIN VERMICOMPOST”

The urbanization of Diphupar ‘B,’ his home for decades, inspired Sharongmangyang to establish Kingkin Vermicompost in November 2024. The name “Kingkin,” derived from the Chang dialect, means earthworms - a fitting name for his organic venture. Recognizing the growing demand for organic manure amidst rapid modernization, he saw an untapped opportunity to promote sustainable farming practices.

With a background in agricultural sciences and practical experience from STINER, NU: SAS, he began small, with one vermicompost bed and just enough raw materials comprising of a truckload of cow dung, earthworms and banana pseudo stems. He also had the support of a close friend. He faced challenges early on, included sourcing cow dung and protecting earthworms from the intense summer heat, which required frequent watering to maintain proper moisture in the vermi bed which did not deter his will to succeed.

Targeting family and friends as his first customers, he initially distributed vermicompost and vermishash to them free of cost. Their positive feedback and publicity through word-of-mouth slowly built a steady customer base. As the demand grew, he engaged school and college students in packaging and earthworm collection, providing them with an opportunity to earn some pocket money.

To reach customers beyond his immediate circle, he promoted Kingkin Vermicompost through Instagram and WhatsApp, drawing buyers even from outside Nagaland. Within a year, the venture expanded from a single bed to multiple beds and he also conducted a one-day vocational training at Government High School, Nihoto, sharing his knowledge with aspiring learners.

Today, Kingkin Vermicompost continues to grow, with products priced at ₹50/kg for vermicompost and ₹60/litre for vermishash. Sharongmangyang looks forward to creating further opportunities and expanding the impact of his venture.

LOOKING BACK: THE FIRST DAYS OF NEHU COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE

On October 20, 1978, forty students, from across the North Eastern states together with six pioneering teachers, gathered to lay the foundation of an institution, that would go on to become a pride for the region. The then Union Minister of Agriculture, Shri Surjeet Singh Barnala, travelled from Delhi to inaugurate the fledgling College of Agriculture under NEHU.



In those early days, the campus comprised of just three buildings - one boys' hostel and two office blocks. Classes were often held in the IETC buildings and at times, in the Veterinary VFA classrooms. Life was far from easy; an acute water shortage meant walking down to a small stream nearby to bathe and wash clothes. Yet, what might seem a hardship today became moments of shared joy then, when the camaraderie of friends turned daily struggles into cherished memories.

The first year of B.Sc. Agriculture was indeed a challenge one. Gradually, as the second year unfolded, facilities improved and the campus began to take shape. Despite the limitations, our teachers gave their very best and equipped us thoroughly with knowledge, discipline and values that we never felt lacking in our academic journey.

Years later, in 2000, the Alumni Association was formed, providing a bond that united generations of SAS students. Since then, on the 20th October of each year, the College Foundation Day has been celebrated with an Alumni Night, rekindling memories and strengthening friendships. The Alumni Association has contributed significantly to the College - a monolith commemorating the Silver Jubilee, a students' corner at the library compound and a two-storied Alumni Guest House, now serving future generations after being handed over to the College authorities.

Today, as the SAS Alumni Association marks its 25th Anniversary, I look back with gratitude and joy. The struggles, the laughter, the bonds of friendship and the dedication of our teachers remain etched in my memory. Those formative years not only shaped our careers but also our lives.

I cherish those days deeply and pray that the spirit of SAS:NU, Medziphema Campus, continues to inspire generations to come. God bless SAS Alumni members.

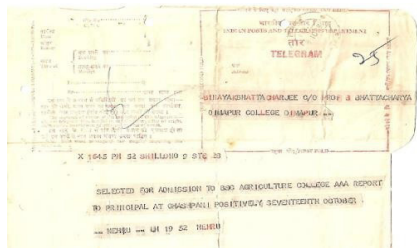

ECHOES FROM THE TELEGRAM DAYS (1978)

“Knock, knock - Postman!” was a familiar call in those days when telegrams carried life- changing news. One such morning, nearly five decades ago, I received a telegram from NEHU Shillong, under the care of my uncle, a professor at Dimapur College informing me that I had been selected and should report to the Principal, Agricultural College, Ghaspani, by 17th October 1978.



It was a defining moment for someone who always loved being close to nature. After completing all admission formalities, I carefully preserved that telegram in a file, unaware that it would one day become a treasured relic of memory. It was lying undisturbed for 47 long years, until it was recently rediscovered.



The NEHU College of Agriculture formally came into existence on 20th October 1978 with 40 students from across the Northeastern states. The inauguration was marked by speeches, cultural programmes and a sumptuous lunch. Classes began soon after, in a modest setting with a handful of teachers and a single hostel - Hostel No. 1.

Life on campus was simple yet vibrant. With no mobile phones or televisions, we found joy in togetherness - playing football, trekking, fishing in nearby streams, cooking and picnicking. Movie enthusiasts were even treated to film shows at the Assam Rifles auditorium for a nominal fee.

However, as days went by, students began to feel the lack of essential facilities such as adequate teachers, proper laboratories, library access and medical care. To address these concerns, an ad-hoc students' union was formed, with Shri. Keyiekhrie Kire as Chairman and myself as General Secretary, to represent our collective voice. When results were slow, peaceful agitation followed, and the college closed briefly for ten days.

A turning point came on 7th May 1980, when the first official Students' Union was established with Myansao Lotha as Vice President and Metsubo Jamir as General Secretary. Our ad-hoc union stepped aside, its purpose fulfilled.



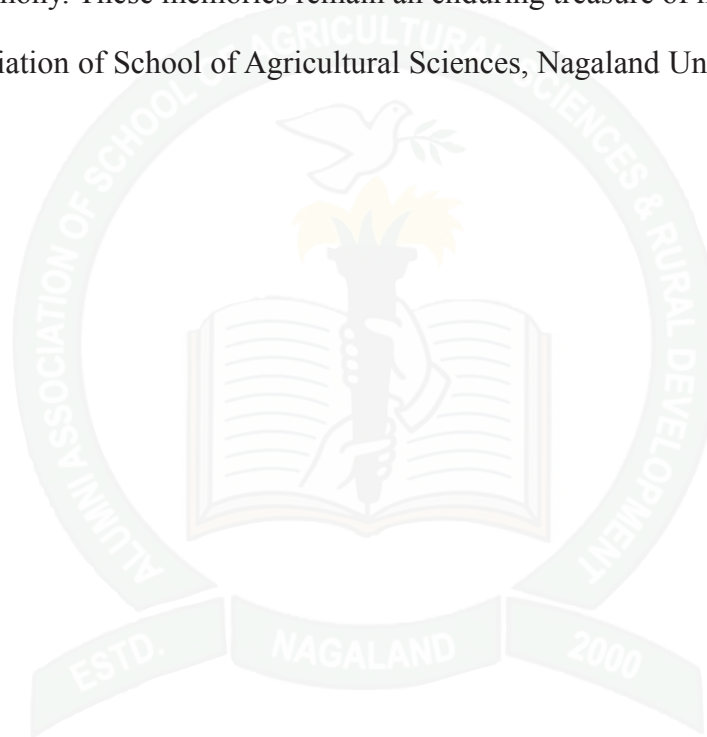

REMINISCENCES OF THE GOLDEN YEARS: 1985–1990, MY JOURNEY TO A DEGREE IN AGRICULTURE

It was in March 1985 that I first travelled to Medziphema with a classmate to apply for admission to P.U. (Agri) under the North Eastern Hill University, College of Agriculture, Medziphema, through open quota. I still remember the joy when a telegram arrived in May 1985, confirming my selection, marking the beginning of my glorious journey to become an alumnus of NEHUCOA. College life was a heterogeneous mix of cultures, where classmates came from every corner of India, from West Bengal UP, Bihar, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and across the Seven Sister states. This diversity inspired my spontaneous poem “Seven Sisters,” later published in *Hill Agri* (Vol. 5).

I had the privilege of learning under distinguished teachers and actively participated in debates, extempore speeches, drama, quizzes and literary activities. Although my cricket skills never shone, six of my poems were published in *Hill Agri* (Decennial Vol. 6). My drama “*Ragging – A Menace*” (1988) won Best Drama, with Shri Pranjal Hazarika as Best Actor, while I earned the Best Actor title in 1990 for “*Tomorrow is a Big Question Mark?*”

In 1988, I was elected Literary Secretary, beating a very talented and capable friend of mine named Zuala. In 1989, I as the Editor of *Hill Agri* (7th Vol.), published the first offset-colour printed edition, approved by the then Pro-VC Prof. Kirem Wati Ao. During my tenure, we organized events for World Environment Day, Population Day, Literacy Day and Photography Day, introducing competitions in essay, quiz, poetry and photography. Our Cultural Secretary Ms. Watimongla Jamir (who later served as Principal, IETC and Director, SAMETI under Department of Agriculture, GoN) organized a Summer Fashion Contest, where Shri. Zenedic Shira and Ms. Thera Marak were crowned *Shri. Summer* and *Ms. Summer* respectively. During our time, Ms. Watimongla was an unbeaten best singer for four consecutive years, earning her the affectionate title “*Nightingale of SASRD.*”

Debating was a spirited tradition. My talented peer Ms. Mikky S.S., was unbeaten in several contests and my friend Shri. Pramod Kumar, who later joined BAS, inspired healthy competition. Despite pressures and playful rivalries, those contests taught me resilience and oratory discipline. In 1990, as Vice-Captain of Liberty House, I won several awards - Best Actor, Second Best Debater, Quiz Competitor, Extempore Speaker, and Mono Actor, helping our house secure the second position overall. The friendship, creativity and competition we shared shaped my confidence and leadership.

Our final farewell came on 21st December 1990, after a memorable feast at Edmund Hillary Hostel. We bid adieu to our beloved college with heavy hearts and tears in our eyes. Leaving the campus was emotional, yet the memories remain fresh, an enduring source of joy and inspiration. In 1992, I was selected again for M.Sc. (Ag.) in Horticulture but had to forgo it upon joining the Assam Tea Corporation Ltd. But the sweet and fond memories remain cherished in my heart - an elixir and an enduring inspiration to live by.

Three cheers and victory to the School of Agriculture Sciences, Medziphema! May its glory continue to shine and spread across the globe as Nagaland University now proudly tops India’s universities in patent registrations.

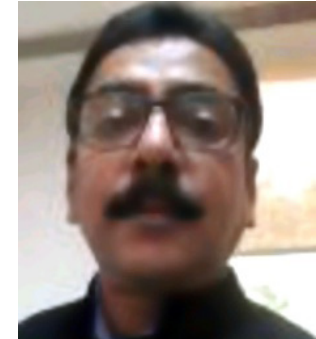
BRIDGING TRADITION AND TECHNOLOGY IN AGRICULTURE – THE INTEGRATION OF INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE WITH MODERN PRACTICES

Humans have practiced farming and food cultivation since the Neolithic period. Over time, agriculture has been shaped and enriched by our traditions. Our ancestors learned to grow crops by closely observing patterns of rainfall, understanding which crops could be integrated with others, and discovering natural ways to protect plants from pests and diseases. They passed down this valuable knowledge, experience, and wisdom through stories, practices and scriptures, always working in harmony with the rhythm of the seasons.

In the present day and age, farming and agriculture have evolved from the past. The use of machines, have eased work with great efficiency, while genetically modified seeds and plants provide greater yields. Also, globalization and better connectivity deliver instant updates on weather conditions/forecast, as well as on government schemes. The touch of a button, allows one to access the internet and find answers to any queries that remain unanswered from their experiences. While these advancements have greatly improved the agricultural productivity and reduced the chances of uncertainty, they have not and cannot replace the value of traditional methods.

The way forward calls for blending the old traditions with new technologies for the best outcome. Combining traditional water harvesting ponds with drip irrigation may contribute to saving crops from drought. The use of cow dung for compost with macro and micro nutrient management could be beneficial for improving soil health and cost effective. A simple task like saving seeds is advantageous when stored using modern storage methods such as seed banks. Tradition provides adaptability as well as strength and technology add efficiency, together creating a proper balance. This balance is vital in places where agriculture is strongly connected to the community's culture and identity. Each community has their own method of farming, shaped by factors such as climate, soil, environment and customs. These methods and practices not only define food cultivation, but also represent a way of living. If we lose these techniques, we may lose a part of our culture, our life.

In the future, rather than choosing between traditional practices and modern methods, it would be wise to embrace a blend of both, using the wisdom of the past to strengthen and refine the tools of the present. In doing so, agriculture will remain sustainable, resilient and deeply connected to the people for generations to come.

AN ENLIGHTENING ENCOUNTER WITH THE FORMER CHIEF MINISTER OF NAGALAND, SHRI. S. C. JAMIR

It is not every day that students get to interact with a leader whose vision has shaped the destiny of an entire state. For us, the editorial board of the School of Agricultural Sciences and Rural Development (SASRD), meeting the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Nagaland, Shri S. C. Jamir, in 1986 was a defining moment in our academic journey. Making the experience even more memorable was the warm presence of Shri C. N. Ngully, the then Commissioner and Secretary of Agriculture and Allied Departments, who, alongside the Chief Minister, welcomed us with exceptional cordiality.



Our editorial team that year comprised Shri. A. K. Handique (Advisor), Shri. R. K. Dhar (Chairman), Shri. Pangjung Jamir, Shri. Balom Apum, Shri. Param Khoisa (Student Members) and myself, Pauline Alila, as Literary Secretary and Editor. With Shri. Dhar, our ever-encouraging English teacher leading us, we felt honored, yet nervous as we stepped into the Chief Minister's office in Kohima. The interaction was far more than a typical interview. It was a deeply inspiring conversation on leadership, rural development, and the role of youth. In response to our first question about the role of agriculture in Nagaland's economy, Shri. Jamir emphasized its foundational importance. "Over seventy percent of our people depend on agriculture and the traditional practices must now be strengthened with science, irrigation, and technology. Institutions like SASRD are critical in this transformation," he stated. He urged us to take our learning beyond the classroom; to serve farmers and communities directly.

On sustainable development, he passionately spoke about balancing progress with preservation. "Our identity is tied to our land, forests, and traditions. Development must empower, not erase," he said. Shri. Ngully added that policies were being shaped to reflect this balance - protecting culture while enabling growth. When asked about opportunities for the educated youth, Shri. Jamir encouraged entrepreneurship. "Government alone cannot absorb every graduate. But agriculture, horticulture, fisheries and agro-industries offer great scope. Our youth must become job creators, not just job seekers."



25 Years of Celebration

The meeting concluded with a heartfelt thanks from Shri. Dhar and encouragement from the Chief Minister, who reminded us that the future of Nagaland rests in the hands of educated, motivated youth. For me, it was not just an editorial task, it was a life lesson in humility, leadership, and service.

Looking back, this interview remains a treasured memory. It wasn't just an article for our bulletin; it was an inspiration that shaped how we saw our role in agriculture and rural development.

RUBBER AND ITS CULTIVATION - WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO NAGALAND

Natural rubber (NR), sourced from the *Hevea brasiliensis* tree, is among the most versatile plant-based raw materials. Native to the Amazon basin, it was introduced to Asia and Africa by the British in the 19th century. In India, the first plantation was set up in Kerala in 1902 and the industry expanded rapidly after World War II with government support. Today, Kerala contributes about 75% of national output, followed by Tripura and Karnataka, while cultivation has spread to several non-traditional regions including Goa, Maharashtra, Odisha, West Bengal, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands and the Northeast.



Rubber is a perennial crop with seven to eight year gestation period, requiring scientific management to ensure high yields and soil health. Its economic importance is immense; about 65% of NR in India is consumed by the automobile sector, especially in tyres. Beyond this, it is used in footwear, conveyor belts, balloons, mattresses, engineering and even road surfacing. In fact, over 50,000 products are made from natural rubber. Despite 941,200 hectares under cultivation and 875,000 tonnes produced annually (as of March 2024), India's demand is much higher at 1.41 million tonnes, leading to imports.

In Nagaland, rubber was introduced in the late 1970s, with commercial plantations emerging in the early 1980s through pioneering growers. Institutional backing followed, with the Rubber Board setting up offices and the Department of Land Resources (DoLR) supporting growers with planting materials, trainings and machineries.

As of March 2025, Nagaland has 25,403 hectares under rubber, though over half of the plantations are still immature. Production is estimated at 15,000 tonnes, with Wokha and Mokokchung leading in area. Under the INROAD scheme, implemented by the Rubber Board and Automotive Tyre Manufacturers Association (ATMA), more than 13,600 hectares have already been planted in Nagaland, with major expansion planned across the Northeast. The district wise split up as of March 2025 of the area is as follows:

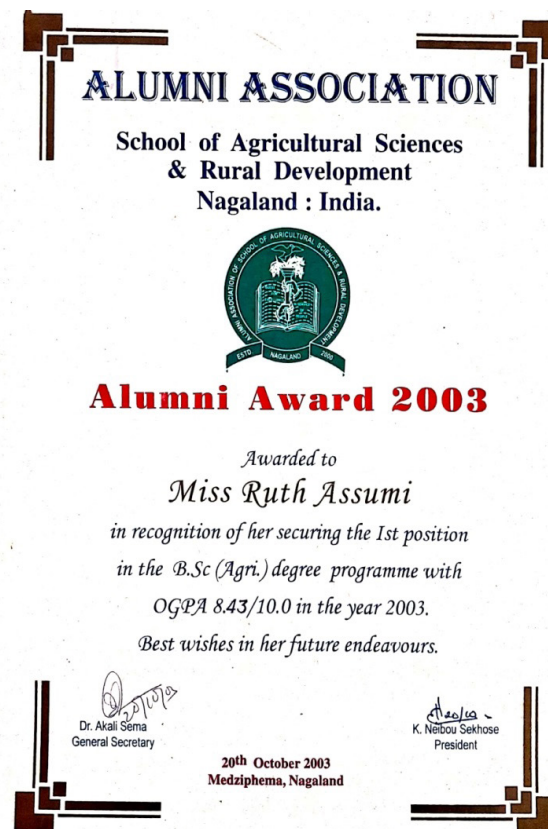




ALUMNI-SPONSORED ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARDS

CELEBRATING 25 YEARS OF LEGACY: SILVER JUBILEE OF THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION OF THE SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES (AASAS)

Inaugural Session

The Alumni Association of the School of Agricultural Sciences (AASAS), Nagaland University, commemorated its 25th Anniversary-the Silver Jubilee - with grandeur and heartfelt nostalgia at the Multi-Purpose Hall, SAS, NU, Medziphema Campus on Monday, 20th October 2025. The celebration brought together alumni from across batches, faculty, students and dignitaries to honor 25 years of shared growth, contribution and unity.

The celebration began with the unveiling of the Silver Jubilee Monument by the Special Guest, Shri. Mhathung Yanthan, Hon'ble MLA and Advisor, Agriculture, Government of Nagaland, in the presence of Shri. Metsübo Jamir (1st Batch), Hon'ble Minister for Rural Development and SIRD, Government of Nagaland and Shri. Marthon J. Sangma, MLA and Advisor to the Government of Meghalaya (Power Department), who joined virtually. The Alumni Flag Hoisting was led by Shri. A. Pangjung Jamir (5th Batch), Hon'ble MLA and Advisor, Fisheries and Aquatic Resources, Government of Nagaland.

An invocation prayer, led by Prof. L. Daiho, Former Dean, SAS, NU, was followed by a welcome address by Shri. K. Neibou Sekhose, Chairman of the Organizing Committee and the 1st President of AASAS. A welcome song presented by alumni led by Dr. Imliakum Ao (29th Batch) and Dr. Chubatemsu Ozukum (28th Batch) set a nostalgic tone. The "Reminiscence" session saw heartfelt reflections from senior alumni Shri. K. Zhekheto Sema (Batch 1979) and Dr. Elizabeth Saipari (Batch 1980), evoking cherished memories of their student days.

Prof. Akali Sema, Secretary of the Organizing Committee and the 1st General Secretary of AASAS, presented the Journey of AASAS, highlighting milestones and achievements. A video montage featuring alumni residing abroad and pioneer teachers added an emotional touch, followed by a minute of silence in memory of 146 departed alumni. The Felicitation Ceremony honored distinguished alumni for their exemplary achievements.

Prof. L. Tongpang Longkumer (5th Batch), President of AASAS, presented Alumni Academic Excellence Awards (2024–25). Formal addresses followed by Shri. Metsübo Jamir, Chief Host and Prof. Dipak Sinha, Pro-Vice Chancellor, SAS, NU. The EU Choir rendered a special number and the Silver Jubilee Souvenir was released by the Special Guest along with dignitaries.

In his Inaugural Address, Shri. Mhathung Yanthan reflected that the Silver Jubilee was not merely a celebration but a tribute to 25 years of excellence and transformation- reaffirmation of the shared mission to empower farmers, nurture youth and uphold agriculture as a dignified profession. He lauded the alumni's continued contribution to the rural and agricultural development.

The session concluded with a Vote of Thanks by Shri. Hoto Yeptho (1st Batch), Organizing Committee Member and 1st Advisor of AASAS. The event was seamlessly compered by Dr. Moakala Changkiri (29th Batch), Scientist, AICRP-VC, followed by batch-wise photography and the Jubilee feast.



25 Years of Celebration

Technical Session on “Fostering Knowledge through Alumni Engagement”

The afternoon Technical Session (2:00–4:00 PM), coordinated by Prof. Pauline Alila (5th Batch), Dean, SAS, NU, featured insightful deliberations on contemporary agricultural challenges and innovations.

Session - I was chaired by Prof. Aleinla Ao, co-chaired by Shri. Ngurthansanga Sailo. Dr. Umed Pun, Horticulture Specialist (FAO, DPRK), an accomplished Ornamental Horticulturist, delivered an insightful talk on the topic “*Trust Transfer from Farm to Fork.*” He holds a B.Sc. (Ag) Gold Medal from the School of Agricultural Sciences and Rural Development, NEHU (India), an M.Sc. (Ag) in Horticulture from OUAT, Odisha, and a Ph.D. in Plant Physiology from Lincoln University, New Zealand. His international academic and professional engagements include visiting professorships at universities in Nepal and Sierra Leone, consultancy in Thailand, and his current role as a Horticulture Specialist with the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). Dr. Pun’s presentation highlighted the importance of **traceability and transparency** in agricultural value chains to build consumer confidence and justify premium pricing for high-quality produce. Drawing from his research on the Thai mango variety *Nam Dok Mai* (meaning “Golden Mango”), he emphasized the concept of “trust transfer” - ensuring that every stage of cultivation, harvesting, processing, and packaging can be verified by consumers. He encouraged the youth of Northeast India, particularly Nagaland, to focus on cultivating **niche indigenous crops** using **modern agro-technologies**. By leveraging the region’s biodiversity and adopting advanced production methods, farmers and entrepreneurs can position their products competitively in both domestic and international markets. Dr. Pun stressed that while such practices may increase production costs, they enhance value through verified quality, leading to consumer trust and sustainable profitability. The key message of his talk centered on the idea that **traceability is the cornerstone of market credibility** — a critical factor for transforming traditional agriculture into a globally recognized, technology-driven enterprise.

The rapporteurs were Dr. Damitre Lytan & Dr. Akumla Longchar while Dr. Jurisandhya Barik Bordoloi was the convener.

Session - II was chaired by Prof. L. Daiho, co-chaired by Dr. E. Saipari, with Shri. Tapu Gopak (IFS), CCF, Retd. as speaker. He is an alumnus of NEHU College of Agriculture, Medziphema (Batch of 1984), presented an engaging talk on “*Symbiotic Relationship between Forestry and Agriculture.*” His distinguished career includes service as Horticulture Inspector in the Department of Agriculture, Government of Arunachal Pradesh, followed by his induction into the Indian Forest Service (IFS) under the AGMUT Cadre (Allotment Year 2005). He retired as Chief Conservator of Forests and currently serves as an Expert Member of the State Expert Appraisal Committee. In his presentation, Shri Gopak elaborated on the **mutual dependence of forestry and agriculture**, emphasizing that sustainable agricultural productivity is intrinsically linked to forest health. He discussed the **ecological functions of forest cover**, including soil conservation, hydrological regulation, and microclimate stabilization — all of which directly influence agricultural sustainability.



The speaker also detailed **irrigation management practices**, focusing on critical irrigation periods for major crops such as rice, millets, bajra, and jowar. He explained that effective water management, supported by robust forest ecosystems, enhances crop yield and resilience. His talk underscored the principle that **forest conservation underpins sustainable water resources**, which in turn sustain agriculture — forming a natural and indispensable symbiotic relationship. Shri Gopak further discussed the rapid expansion of **hydropower projects in Arunachal Pradesh**, projecting their transformative potential for energy and infrastructure development in the region. However, he cautioned that unplanned development could lead to ecological imbalance, advocating instead for **integrated natural resource management** that harmonizes economic growth with environmental stewardship.

The rapporteurs were Dr. Engrala Ao and Dr. K. Ajay Kumar, while the sessions were convened by Dr. Pankaj Neog.

General Body Meeting
